Mission: The Canadian Council of Social Work Regulators provides a national structure for provincial and territorial social work regulatory authorities to act together as the voice, both nationally and internationally, on social work regulatory matters in Canada.

1. ACTIVELY SUPPORT AND PARTICIPATE IN INTERSECTORAL COMMITTEE GOALS

Objectives:

- * Reconfirm Committee representation of CCSWR President and Vice-President
- * Continue to discuss and collaborate on grant opportunities
- * Track and discuss follow up from CASW child welfare project
- * Monitor issue of approval of non-accredited social work education programs

2. INITIATE ACTION TO ADDRESS INTERJURISDICTIONAL PRACTICE ISSUES AND NEEDS

Objectives:

- * Continue collaborative work on electronic practice policies
- * Continue to collaborate work on mobility/portability policies
- * Advance the development of an anti-racist regulatory practice tool for use by provincial regulators
- * Explore integration of existing resources, policies and research
- * Monitor progress and trends related to interjurisdictional practice by other regulators in social work and other professions (i.e. exam use)

3. COLLABORATE TO SUPPORT AND ENGAGE IN DISCUSSION REGARDING PATH TO RECONCILIATION AND IMPACTS OF REGULATION

Objectives:

- * Explore how current codes of ethics, standards of practice, resources and policies reflect goals of reconciliation
- * Explore current initiatives by regulators that reflect principles of reconciliation
- * Explore and address regulatory issues associated with the mutual recognition agreement between the National Indigenous Accreditation Board (NIAB) and the Canadian Association for Social Work Education

4. EXPLORE AREAS OF COMMONALITIES AND CHALLENGES RELATED TO REGULATION OF CHILD WELFARE WORKERS WITH A VIEW TO DEVELOP A STRATEGY DOCUMENT

Objectives:

- * Expand jurisdictional scan related to regulation of child welfare workers into a strategy document for use by the provincial regulators
